

Applying to Become a Lecturer at Node Center

Thank you for your interest in teaching at Node Center for Curatorial Studies. We're always happy to connect with curators and art professionals who are interested in sharing their knowledge with our international community.

This document outlines our lecturer application process and what we look for in new course proposals.

Who We Collaborate With

Node Center works with experienced practitioners in the fields of curating, exhibition-making, arts management, and related cultural practices. Our courses are designed for emerging and mid-career professionals and focus on practical, real-world skills.

Application Materials

To formally apply to become a lecturer at Node Center, please prepare the following:

1. Curriculum Vitae (CV)

A brief CV highlighting your professional experience, teaching background (if applicable), and areas of expertise.

2. Website or Portfolio Links

Links to your website, portfolio, or other relevant online material that helps us understand your practice and experience.

3. Short Course Proposals

Please include 2–3 brief course ideas (1 short paragraph each).

These should:

- Clearly state the topic
- Indicate the practical skills or outcomes participants would gain
- Align with Node Center's focus on applied, hands-on learning

We recommend reviewing our existing courses before submitting proposals, to ensure your ideas offer a distinct perspective or address a gap in our current program.

What We Prioritize

When reviewing applications, we typically prioritize:

- Practical, skills-based courses
- Clear learning outcomes
- Topics grounded in professional experience
- Courses that complement (rather than duplicate) our current offerings.

Course proposals that are primarily theoretical or historical in nature are generally not prioritized, as our focus is on practical, applied learning.
